

THE CORONATION CUP

TERMS OF ENTRY

Male members of Llanymynech Golf Club, including juniors, can enter The Coronation Cup through the BRS Booking system. Two or more juniors are NOT allowed to play in the same group, and it is a recommendation of the competition committee that juniors refrain from playing with another family member. To win a board competition, participants need three WHS counting scores within the past year. All entrants must sign in and pay a £2.50 entry fee to the club professional or a designated officer on the day of the competition.

FORMAT AND TIES

The Coronation Cup is a medal competition for the best nett score, to be played over 18 holes from the White Course, using the White Course slope rating for handicap purposes. In the event of a tie, countback will be employed to determine the winner as follows: the best score for the last 9 holes, followed by the last 6 holes, then the last 3 holes, and finally, the last hole. If the tie persists, it will be resolved based on the last 6 holes of the first 9 holes, then the last 3 holes of the first 9 holes, and lastly, the last hole of the first 9 holes. Should this procedure still fail to separate the tie, a play-off over 18 holes will be arranged at a mutually convenient date and time.

HANDICAP ALLOWANCE

The handicap allowance is set at 95% of the course handicap, with a maximum playing handicap of 24. All participants are required to have an active handicap within the World Handicap System.

MARKERS

When competitors share a tee time in their competition, scorecards should be exchanged on the first tee before starting the round. Each competitor should ensure his scorecard correctly holds his name, tee time, competition details and entry number

PRIZES

This is a Board Competition and there will be a 1st, 2nd and 3rd best nett prize and a best gross prize. The prizes will be in the format of a voucher which will be redeemable through the Club Professional's shop. The value of prize vouchers will be set and reviewed each year by the competition committee. All winners are required to attend the presentation evening. The competition committee will send an official invitation via letter or email to each winner, inviting them to the event. In exceptional circumstances if they are unable to attend, they should inform the Captain or The Chair of Competitions and nominate someone to receive the Prize on their behalf.

CANCELLATION

The Coronation Cup may be abandoned, cancelled or postponed by the following officials: - Club Professional or Assistant, Greenstaff, Chair of the Competitions Committee or a Member of the Management Committee.

This could occur because of adverse weather conditions, or if the course is found to be not fit for purpose, or any other unforeseen circumstances.

In any case, the Committee will endeavour to re-schedule the event, if the busy fixture list allows.

THE SCORECARD

All individual scores must be recorded on the Club's Scorecard and must be signed by both the marker and the player. Cards must be deposited into the competition box below the PSI Machine in a timely manner. Failure to do so will lead to disqualification from the competition. A player's handicap is maintained within the World Handicap System by recording their score electronically after every qualifying competition on the day of playing.

THE COMPETITION RESULT

The results of The Coronation Cup become final upon their publication on the Club Website.
